AROUND 100 BSJV STAFF ATTEND TAHLIL AT ROYAL MAUSOLEUM

In conjunction with the holy month of Ramadhan and as part of staff religious activities, a delegation of around 100 Muslim staff from Brunei Shell Petroleum Company Sdn Bhd (BSP), Brunei Gas Carriers Sdn Bhd (BGC) and Brunei LNG Sdn Bhd (BLNG), took part in a Recital of Surah Yaasin and Tahlil ceremony at the Royal Mausoleum at Jalan Tutong on Wednesday, August 15, 2012, for the late Al-Marhum Sultan Haji Omar Ali Saifuddien Sa'adul Khairi Waddien and Al-Marhumah Duli Raja Isteri Pengiran Anak Damit.

It is common for Muslims in Brunei to visit the graves of loved ones to clean the grave, recite Surah Yaasin, and perform the tahlil ceremony, as a means to ask Allah to grant forgiveness for both the deceased and the living.

Leading the staff delegation from the above Brunei Shell Joint Venture (BSJV) companies was Yang Mulia Haji Salleh Bostaman bin Haji Zainal Abidin, BSP Deputy Managing Director.

Also present were Yang Mulia Haji Shahbudin bin Haji Musa, BGC Managing Director, Yang Mulia Haji Kamaludin bin Haji Bungsu, BSP Human Resource Director, as well as senior management and staff from BGC, BSP and BLNG.

Meanwhile, the recitals were led by Yang Mulia Haji Abd Rahman bin Mukkim, from BSP's Business Services.
