### **BSP HOLDS VENDOR BUSINESS INTEGRITY DAY**

Brunei Shell Petroleum Company Sdn Bhd (BSP) on Monday, February 20, 2012 organised the Vendor Business Integrity Day at Pusat Insani in Seria.

The event was officiated by Yang Mulia Awang Haji Jamain bin Haji Julaihi, Deputy Permanent Secretary (Downstream and Power) of the Energy Department at the Prime Minister's Office who was the guest of honour for the event.

Also in attendance was Yang Mulia Hj Juanda bin A. Rashid, Deputy Permanent Secretary, Prime Minister's Office (Security and Enforcement Affairs) and Director of Anti-Corruption Bureau as well as Ken Marnoch, BSP Managing Director and senior from the BSJV Companies.

The 2nd Vendor Business Integrity Day is a key event in BSP's continuous Business Integrity Drive. It aims to refresh contractors and vendors knowledge of the Brunei Shell Joint Venture Business Principles and Code of Conduct.

The Director of Anti-Corruption at the event made a presentation on the dangers of corruption which was later followed by two video presentations. The event also showcased an exhibition by the ACB and BSP which highlights this Code of Conduct and a roundtable session with the vendors to discuss such mechanisms.

The Brunei Shell Joint Venture Companies uphold business integrity as one of its core values. In doing business, the BSJV companies are governed by The Brunei Laws and all the employees are guided by the BSJV companies' Code of Conduct.

Over the years, BSJV Companies together with the Anti-Corruption Bureau have held regular road shows to educate BSJV staff and BSJV contractors on Business Integrity, LAPOR and Shell Global Helplines to allow confidential reporting, dedicated investigations capability working in close cooperation with the Anti-Corruption Bureau.
